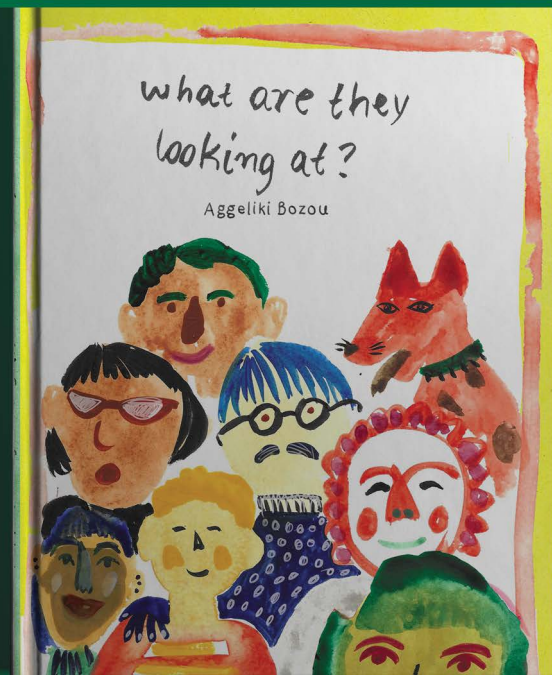
## WHAT ARE THEY LOOKING AT?

Aliki Yannaki & Mathaios Amanatiadis

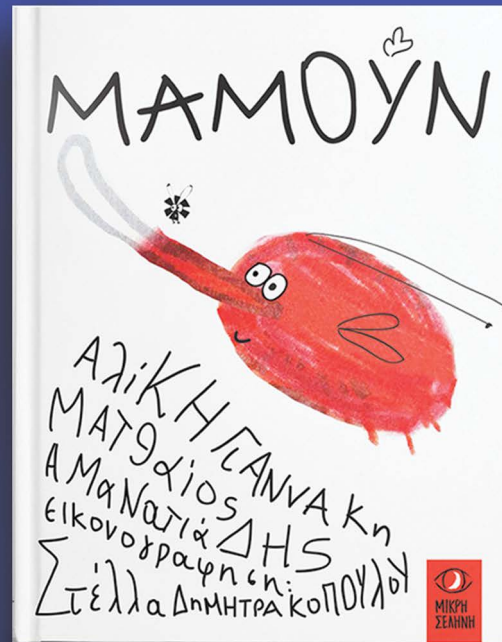

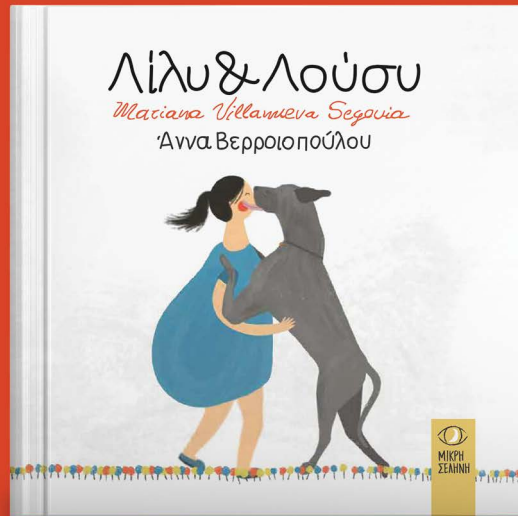


## LILY AND LUCY

The story of Timmy, however, is different. Because since he was very young Timmy has had a unique gift, rare and special. Even though he doesn't talk a lot, he has the ability to listen. To listen carefully, not just to the secrets confided in him by people of this world, but also to those "not of this world". They are the shadows of the mansion into which he has just moved; its late inhabitants who have left this life and live in a parallel world – the world of ghosts.

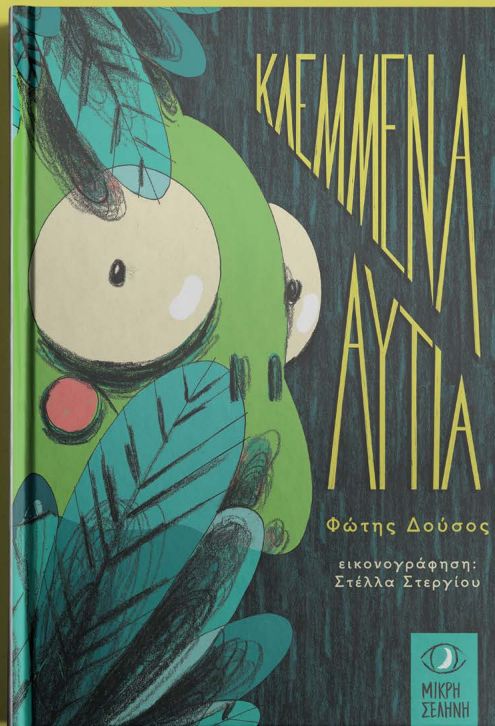


## STOLEN EARS

With no time to lose, Ham decides to plug up his courage and put his skills to the test, leading him to a thriving investigation in which he will find himself facing a difficult decision. The book was shortlisted for the Greek National Prize for Children's Literature 2021.

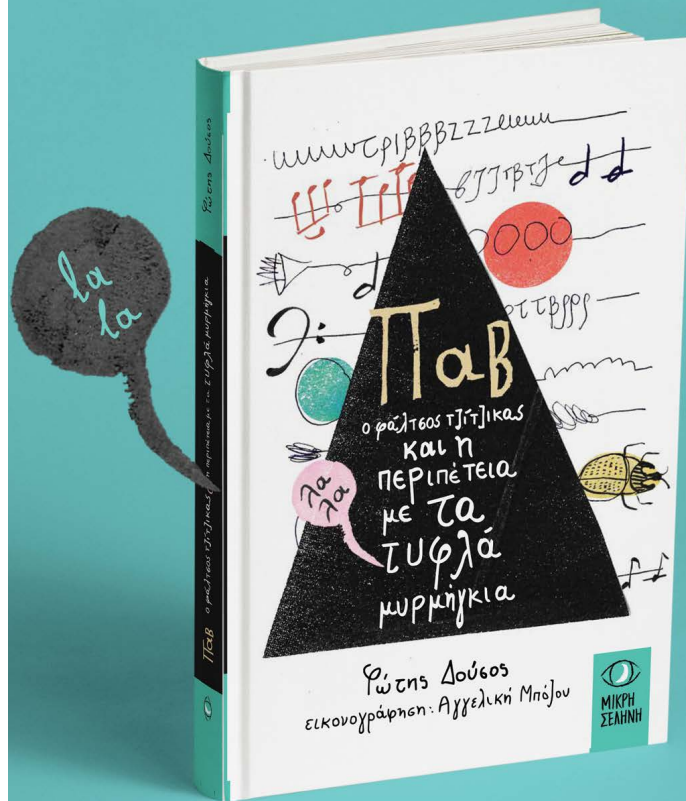
## PAV

72pp 17 x 24 cm | **Age 9+**

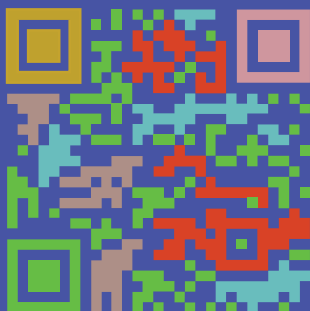
